This newsletter we are stepping back in time as we review the premier issue of "**Battlecry**" from May 1962. The association will be preserving this for posterity! It is in excellent condition!

Here are some highlights:

April 27 - The first play, Me, Myself and I, played to a near capacity audience under the direction of Mr. Potokar. Mr. Specht chaired art direction of the sets & technical direction.

May 3 - THE ARCHIVE was elected as the name for the yearbook. THE HERITAGE was the runner-up. The editorial staff was led by Miss Korba and the business staff had Mrs. Szmagala as its advisor.

May 4 - The first assembly was held in the auditorium. Students excitedly sang the new Alma Mater (written by Lydia Grafinger, Class of '64) with the band.

May 10 - Twenty-four Juniors were inducted into the Nat'l Honor Society as charter members of the VF Chapter.

May 24 - A faculty committee selected the 62-63 varsity and junior varsity cheerleaders.

May 25 - Elections were held for officers of the first Student Council for the 62-63 school year.

"The Anvil", student literary magazine, made its debut with sixty pages written entirely by students from the freshman and sophomore classes.

1962 was the beginning of organizing the clubs at VF. Key Club, Latin Club, Y-Teens, Hi-Y, Booster Club, Future Nurses and Future Teachers of America were the first. The JV Football season ended with a six won, one lost record. JV Basketball season brought it's first trophy "home" with a fifteen win, three loss record for the 61-62 season.
